DESIREE HAJNY TO INSTRUCT IN 2008 – Rick Brereton

Desiree Hajny is regarded as one of America's finest three-dimensional realistic animal carvers. She was voted the 2003 "Woodcarver of the Year" by Woodcarving Illustrated Magazine and represented the U.S. at the International Woodcarvers Convention in 2004. Originally a high school art teacher, Desiree has turned her passion for art, wildlife and people into a full time career. She is ably assisted in this pursuit by her husband Bernie, also a former teacher.

Desiree teaches seminars, competes and judges in carving competitions, gives demonstrations and has authored six books on carving animals, both realistic and caricature. She is a regular contributing editor to most of the carving magazines. She has exhibited nationally and internationally, as of 2005 winning 17 Best-of-Show honours, more than 75 first places and six People's Choice Awards. She was also selected to carve animals for Disney's Animal Kingdom, the newest theme park at Disney World.

Desiree was the featured instructor at the 38th Annual Flickertail Woodcarving Show in Bismarck, North Dakota in October 2007. Cathie and Rick Brereton were lucky enough to take not one, but two classes with Desiree. Without hesitation, they rate Desiree as one of the best woodcarving instructors they have encountered, as well as one of the nicest people they have met during their woodcarving travels.

While at the Bismarck Show, on behalf of our Club, we completed arrangements for Desiree to teach two classes here in Winnipeg in September 2008. Each class will be 3 days, from 9:00 am - 5:00 pm, with maximum of 12 students in each class. The dates for the classes are:

Class #1 Monday, September 8 to Wednesday, September 10 Class #2 Friday, September 12 to Sunday, September 14

The project, as shown in the photo below, is a cougar with two cubs. Students will be provided a rough-out blank in basswood.

Dear Ron & Flickertail Woodcarvers,

Sorry about the delay in this card being sent, but I'd like to thank-you for all of your help in creating our snow snakes. Our Kids were extremely excited about our project. Sadly, there has not been enough snow to use them, but they are beautiful, and we are grateful for your help!

A Few Tips on Carving Eyes:

1. When you carve the egg shaped area for the face/head on your carving, remember that the nose is the part that protrudes the most. The eyes fall within an arch with the chin and forehead.

- 2. Draw a centerline down the face and then draw a horizontal line across the area for the brow and eyeball.
- 3. Using a compass, measure out from the point where the two lines cross. This will allow you to locate the exact center of each eyeball.
- 4. Then use the compass to make a rough circle showing the area that will be the eyeball. Some of the area will be under the brow and some will be lower lid wrinkles on the underside. You must think of the eye of your carving as a ball.
- 5. After you have the eyeball area roughed in and the eye openings (lids) carved you can once again use the compass to provide exact and equal locations for the iris and pupils. You must remember that you rarely see the complete circle of the iris/pupil. Much of it is under the lids. Mainly the upper lid. You can again use the compass to place the "look" in the same direction, right/lift/up/down. You can also place the glint in the eye with the compass to pinpoint the location.

When using the knife to make stop cuts and plunge cuts along the lids, watch you don't cut too deep. If you do cut too deep, you can sometimes make corrections using a hard surfaced tool to push the track left by the knife back together again.

You might try burnishing the carved part of the eyeball with a hardwood tool or metal tool. This will push the wood fibers and grains disturbed by the knife back together for a more compressed surface. This will make a better painted eye.

If you decide to sand around the eye, remember that you are finished carving as the grit on the sandpaper will take the edge off your knife. After your first sanding wet the area with water and let it dry. Then use a crumpled brown paper bag to burnish the area and knock the fibers down. You can then seal the carving. You may use the bag after each coat of sealant until the final coat. You should have a really nice finished area.

Bob Matzke made this editor aware of a change in the North Dakota tax law. The information from the Tax Commissioner is included in this newsletter to ensure the members are aware of the change. Bob Pedigo – our acting President – has been made aware of the change. Further information may be forthcoming.

HB 1074:

Effective August 1, 2007, promoters of special events that have ten or more vendors participating at an event are required to provide the Tax Commissioner's Office with a list of all vendors that are making sales, providing displays, or otherwise engaging in promotional activities at the special event. The vendor list is to be provided within twenty days of the event. Special events are defined as an entertainment, amusement, recreation, or marketing event that occurs at a single location on a recurring or irregular basis. Examples of special events are: auto shows, boat shows, gun shows, sport shows, craft shows, flea markets, carnivals, bazaars, arts and craft shows, and trade shows. Special events do not include events that are organized for the exclusive benefit of a nonprofit organization and all of the net proceeds from the event sales go to the benefit of nonprofit organizations. Special Events

For tax purposes, the State of North Dakota defines special events as entertainment, amusement, recreation or marketing events that occurs at a single location on a recurring or irregular basis.

These events include, but are not limited to: auto shows, gun shows, sport shows, concerts, carnivals, flea markets and trade shows.

Club Approved for IRS 501(c)(3) Status

We have received approval from the Internal Revenue Service to be recognized as a 501(c)(3) organization. This allows us to qualify for more grants that are available to arts organizations in our area. We're hopeful that we can receive more funding to support our annual show, our guest instructors, and possibly some club operations such as the newsletter and club library.

Another facet of this status is that donations to our club are tax deductible. These donations must be made without the club providing a benefit-in-kind. This means that any donations that are deductible can not be made for goods or services in return. Items like the cost of purchasing raffle tickets are not deductible since the purchaser could win a prize for purchasing a ticket.

However, if you have a rich uncle that can't figure out what to do with all his money, you could convince him to donate it to the club and he could then deduct that from his taxes. We will be discussing a method of providing a receipt to donors in the event any items or cash are donated to the club. This is effective at the time of IRS approval (June 2007) and is not retroactive. If you've donated an item to the club in the past we sincerely appreciate it, but we are not able to provide you with a proof of deduction for your donation. We plan to do so for any future donations.

IRS

The Internal Revenue Service recently announced new annual electronic filing requirements for small tax-exempt organizations.

Beginning in 2008, small tax-exempt organizations that were previously not required to file returns may be required to file an annual electronic notice. Form 990 or 990EZ (e-postcard) for tax exempt organizations not required to file form 990 or 990-EZ. The filing requirement applies to tax periods beginning after December 31, 2006.

The IRS will mail educational letters starting July 2007 notifying small tax exempt organizations that they may be required to file the e-postcard with the IRS annually. The IRS is developing an electronic filing system (there will be no paper form) for the e-postcard.

The new requirement requires the IRS to revoke tax-exempt status of any organization that fails to meet the annual filing requirement for three consecutive years

Evaluation of 2008 Annual Carving Seminars

Rosalyn Leach Daisey of Newark, Delaware was contracted to be featured carver at our annual show and to conduct two wood carving seminars, one carving a miniature Canada Goose and the second carving a Gold Finch. In addition she presented a lecture/demonstration on habitat development. The following is a summary of the evaluation results based on the attached copy of the evaluation instrument.

Roz scored an average of 4.7 on the 7 questions that contained a scale ranging from 5 (Great Extent) to 1 (Minimal Extent).

The questions were as follows:

To what extent did the guest artist share his/her artistic talent?

To what extent did the guest artist provide step by step carving instructions?

To what extent were carving instructions clear and succinct?

To what extent did the instructor demonstrate carving techniques?

To what extent did the instructor provide texturing instructions?

To what extent did the instructor provide finishing instructions?

To what extent did the instructor discuss mounting and habitat ideas?

The 9 participating carvers gave Ms. Daisey very high ratings on each of the questions. The most valuable part of the seminar was learning the use of various bits when doing power carving, texturing and painting techniques, and the step by step instructions with measurements for each step.

The thing the participants liked least about the seminar was the long days carving and not enough time to complete some of the carving steps.


The average rating on the seven questions for the Gold Finch seminar was 4.9, almost a perfect 5.

The participants liked the well organized instruction and the many carving, texturing and painting tips that were share by Roz.

The Habitat presentation was excellent and full of tips and techniques along with a list of tools and supplies to build habitat. For more information on habitat participants were referred to the Habitat section of her books.
