
## Knife cover with leather insert Pattern by Becky Barnes


[Left] Pick one half of your blank pair to cut a shallow insert. It should only be deep enough for a strip of leather to fit flush when glued in place. Make sure the leather is wider than your knife, but narrower than the wood cover.



[Right] Repeat with the other half. Before gluing the leather, trace your knife shape onto the cover, and deepen that area - specifically where the spine of your knife is thickest. Taper towards the cutting edge. Add glue ONLY to the wood perimeter face, and clamp the sides together, leather facing each other. Finish shaping and sanding after it dries.




