




Red River Valley International Wood Arts Festival, Fargo, ND May 2-5, 2025

The May Flickertail meeting was voted to be canceled at the April meeting, as many of the club members would be in Fargo for the Red River Valley Woodcarvers' show, at the FM Air Museum. Many were taking classes, such as relief carving with John Engler. Becky B. was also teaching the cross-stitch on wood class that she taught at the Flickertail show in October.

Having never gone before, it was an interesting comparison between the Bismarck and Fargo-Moorhead club show styles. The RRVWC had a line of tables dedicated to a judged carving theme - the theme was "What a relief!". Those entering the show were given two tickets - one for Peoples Choice, and one for Carvers Choice. They also did not gather as a group for a potluck or banquet - different than the Flickertails' show. With the Air Museum being close to the NDSU campus, there wasn't a lack of choices for places to eat, however.



May 20, 2025

Committee Reports

Membership (Doug Smith): New member Daniel says he attended a whittle-in many years ago as a middle-schooler, and wants to learn more. Welcome!

Programs (Eric Gaasland): The "Winter Celebration" keeps moving closer and closer to Spring, and doesn't feel as "winter-y" anymore. There was a brief discussion on moving it to November instead, so people could work on smaller projects like ornaments, and have them ready in time for December. Eric will look into scheduling it.

July 26 - **Bluegrass Goes Pink** at Cross Ranch State Park. Cliff is leading that carving demonstration. It's a fun time with carving early on, optional camping / tenting available, and a great dinner. Join in on the walk-run event.

August 2-3 - **Capital A'Fair** around the Capitol loop. Becky W. is leading that event. New setup spot! The flat, brick portion of the State Library walkway on the west side of the building, from the stairs to the road, is fair game for setup. We're not poking spikes into the ground, so we can set up on the flat, right up against the road, which will make the group much more accessible to walkers, wheelchairs, and mobility devices.

August 10 - a request to demonstrate at the Former Governor's Mansion during their **Ice Cream Social** in celebration of 200 years of Norwegian immigration. Suggested by former Heritage Center director and Sons of Norway member Claudia Berg. Who doesn't like ice cream? Sounds like a fun time. Eric will take point of contact.

September 6-7 - **South Central Threshing Bee** in Braddock, ND - overlaps the first meeting in September, but the club said they wanted to demonstrate. We will need to iron things out closer to September to see who is going and who is staying.

June 17 / July 15 / August 19 - next three gatherings will be picnic-style / brown-bag supper at **Sertoma Park shelter** #5, generally starting around 5-5:30, and ending around 7-8pm, or whenever people get tired or rained out.

Historian (Clara Yonker): Becky B. still has one box of material she will drop off with the club leadership.

The suggested theme for this year is "Agriculture" - that could mean crops, animals, forestry, aquaculture - whatever it means to you, carve it!

We're in talks with St. Cloud and Fargo over event dates, so there will hopefully be less overlap

in the future. It's not as easy as just picking dates however - we all have to work around building schedules, reservations, and instructors.



Meeting was adjourned.




May 20, 2025 Whittle-In Batching Dinosaur by Michaela Rose



Carvings from the Collections: Woodworking from the Beritage Center and State Museum

2017.1.1 - Stool

Norwegian Kubbestol, carved by Otto Aaland from a single piece of log. Covered in North Dakota symbols, including the state capitol (on the top back and front base), state seal (on the front base), and a meadowlark and prairie rose (side of base). The front side of the chair back is covered in intricate swirls, a series of leaves are carved into the edges of the chair. Base is hollow, on the inside of base is carved "O.P.A./2015". On the outside of the base is "NORTH DAKOTA". The seat is covered with a round green pillow with piping in the seams. Outer layer of wood has been stained with a light color wood stain.
