## Committee Reports

For our Spring class, it was suggested that we try to contact Dick Skauge for a Bellamy Eagle carving project in Butternut wood. The consensus is that is a good choice, and Eric will contact him.

Winter Celebration was discussed. After discussion the group decided that a full day in December would be chosen to have an “Ornament Day” which is like that which the Garrison club has held in the past. A few instructors will provide cutouts for ornaments, and each project should take approximately two hours to complete and then continue to the next project led by the next instructor. The preferred date is Saturday, December 13.

We need to consider a new theme for another library display in the future since the library has invited us back in the future. Bob P will contact the library to check available dates and report at the December meeting.

Elections are to be held in February for club officers. We need to form a nominating committee which President Becky Weisgerber will begin.

### ***New facility for Fall show discussion.***

The current cost for rental of the Bismarck Career Academy continues to rise. The club is considering holding our show in another location. Since the number of carvers who have displayed is decreasing the consensus that a smaller facility may be a better choice. Cliff Orgaard has visited the Bismarck Eagles and believes that facility has ample space and could be rented for \$300 for an entire weekend. The Bismarck Eagles has an on-site restaurant and could cook burgers and deliver them to our tables. There is an opening for the weekend of October 10-11, 2026, which is currently the only available weekend in October.

Cliff can reserve the facility with no deposit and no penalty if we cancel. Members feel the month of October works for our show but should not rule out late September or early November, however, most feel the October dates are preferable. The consensus is to keep the October dates if possible. Two of our new members have worked at the Mandan Eagles and agreed to contact the manager there to discuss possible dates and prices as well. The location is still not finalized but the membership agreed that Cliff should contact the Bismarck Eagles to hold October 10-11, 2026, for our show.

By icicle.


What award did the snowman win?

Minneapolis Institute of Art



There are many wood carvings inside the [Minneapolis Institute of Art](#), and examples of wooden architecture as well. The first piece I'll highlight is the "Processional image of a Large Swan." The carving is filled with intricate details, and a multitude of mixed-media additions. The plaque next to it reads:

"India

**Processional image of a Large Swan** (Velya Annam), Kerala, 19<sup>th</sup> century Jackfruit wood, pigments, cloth, mirrors, beetle wings, paper

This radiating "large swan" bust would have formed part of a processional structure measuring more than 40 feet tall. Unique to the Neelamperoor Pally Bhagavathi Temple, in the southwestern coastal state of Kerala, it was commissioned as an effigy of the goddess Kali during the Pooram Padayani festival. It is believed that once Kali was satisfied, she could assume the benevolent role of fertility goddess and bless the harvest of the once largely farm-based economy.

The elaborately constructed effigy remains a highlight of this annual ritual. It is remarkable that an essentially ephemeral processional sculpture of this scale, age, and quality is so well preserved. The fluid integration of varied materials (cloth, mirrors, pigment, and wood) into a mesmerizing pattern demonstrates the wonders of Kerala's ritual aesthetics."



As you move around the sculpture, the mirrors and beetle wings would reflect the light. It would have



been a glinting wonder to see in sunlight with all the reflectors intact.
